GETTING THERE

FLIGHTS Flights to Geraldton depart daily from Perth.

DRIVING Geraldton is approx. 420km from Perth which is around a 4.5-hour drive.

TRANSFERS

AACHWA will provide a coach bus transfer service from Perth to Geraldton on Sunday 23 October and return to Perth on Saturday 29 October. You will be asked to register your interest in using this service during the online registration process.

Daily bus transfer service will be available each day from the Nesuto apartments Geraldton to the forum venue (Aboriginal Learning Centre, Geraldton TAFE). Coach transport will also be arranged by AACHWA for excursions as required.
